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Contacting Teachers

Urgent messages can be passed via staff on the gate or at reception but it is unlikely you will be able to speak to the teacher immediately.

SEND pupils

If your pupil is on the school SEND list and you wish to contact the SENCO please email senco@threetrees.risemat.co.uk. She will respond to you within two/three working days.


If you are concerned that your child may have SEND then the classteacher is the best person to speak to first. All SEND pupils will receive a double parents evening appointment in Autumn and Spring.

Religious festivals calendar - a quick insight

Chinese New Year

WHO? Chinese people and families all around the world. WHEN? Saturday 10th February 2024

The date of the Chinese New Year is determined by the lunar calendar. The holiday falls on the second new moon after the winter solstice on December 21st Each year the New Year in China falls on a different date than on the Gregorian calendar. The dates usually range sometime between January 21st and February 20th.



WHAT? The Chinese New Year (新年) is also known as the Spring Festival (春节). It is the most solemn festival of the year for the Chinese community and has been celebrated in China for thousands of years, with various forms of activities among the diverse regions of China. In many countries, each year is also associated with an animal of the zodiac. This new year will be known as the 'Year of the Dragon'



CUSTOMS & PRACTICES? This celebration is centred around removing the bad and the old and welcoming the new and the good. It's a time to worship ancestors, get rid of evil spirits and pray for a good harvest. Lion dances, dragon dances, temple fairs, flower market shopping and so on are a few examples of rich and colourful activities that may take place. As an important family reunion occasion, food and drink are a crucial part of the New Year celebration. Members of the family sit around a big table to have a New Year's Eve dinner. Families burn incense to worship their ancestors. Older

and senior members of the family give younger children good luck pocket money in a red envelope/wallet. Everyone would have a thorough bath to cleanse themselves and wash away the bad luck before the end of the year. People would change into new clothes/new outfits for the festive period. Firecrackers might be set off at midnight to welcome in the New Year.




Donations needed in Foundation Stage!







<u>Year 6 DT</u>

Safer Internet Day

Safer Internet Day takes place every February



On Tuesday 6th February we will be joining schools and youth organisations across the UK in celebrating Safer Internet Day 2024. Safer Internet Day is a global campaign to promote the safe and responsible use of technology, which calls on young people, parents, carers, teachers, social workers, law enforcement, companies, policymakers and more, to help to create a better internet.

This year the campaign will be focusing on change online, this includes covering:

- · Young people's perspective on new and emerging technology
 - Using the internet to make change for the better
 - . The changes young people want to see online
- . The things that can influence and change the way young people think, feel and act online and offline

Using the internet safely and positively is a key message that we promote in school and celebrating Safer Internet Day is a great opportunity for us to re-emphasise the online safety messages we deliver throughout the year. We would be delighted if you could join us in celebrating the day by continuing the conversation at home, whether you have 5 minutes to start a conversation or hours to spare it is important to have conversations with your child.

How you can help at home

Have a conversation Ask your children to tell you about the sites they like to visit and what they enjoy doing online. What games do you and your friends like to play online? Can you show me the websites you visit the most? Shall we play your It is really important to chat with your children favourite game online together? on an ongoing basis about staying safe online. Not sure where to begin? These conversation starter suggestions can help. Ask them about how they stay safe online. What tips do they have for you, and where did they learn them? What is OK and not OK to share? Ask them if they know where to go for help. Where can they go to find the safety advice, privacy settings and how to report or block on the services they use? Think about how you each use the internet. What more could you do to use the internet together? Are there activities that you could enjoy as a family?
