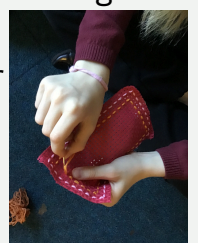

We are delighted to share that our **Year 6 Residential Trip** was a fantastic success! The children represented the school brilliantly throughout the visit, embracing new challenges with courage, enthusiasm and determination.

During the trip, the children truly embodied our core values of perseverance, courage and joy as they took part in a wide range of exciting outdoor and team-building activities. Many stepped outside of their comfort zones, showed incredible bravery and supported one another to overcome challenges. Their positive attitudes, teamwork and excellent behaviour made us all very proud.

Highlights of the visit included a number of thrilling activities, such as the Leap of Faith, where children climbed to the top of a wooden pole before jumping towards a suspended bar; the Nightline, which required groups to work together while blindfolded, relying on clear communication and trust to navigate an assault course; and the Gladiator, a demanding vertical rope challenge.

Evenings were filled with laughter and shared experiences, helping to strengthen friendships and create lasting memories as the children approach the end of their primary school journey. Throughout the visit, the children showed great respect for the centre, the staff and one another, while developing independence, resilience and confidence.

Overall, the residential was a memorable and enriching experience that helped the children grow both personally and socially: an achievement they should all be very proud of. We would also like to thank parents and carers for their support in preparing the children so well for the trip: your help with packing, organisation and encouragement made a real difference.
